(1 Samuel 18: 6-9; 19: 1-7, Mark 3: 7-12) As I considered the relationship between David and Jonathan, I was reminded of Saint Aelred's treatise on Spiritual Friendship. "Friendship is agreement on both human and divine affairs, combined with goodwill and affection." "Whenever people are in perfect agreement about divine and human affairs and have the same desires along with goodwill and affection, then they have attained perfect friendship." "For each party in his mind ought to esteem the same things—that is, their unanimity should be agreeable and dear to them; moreover, their subsequent actions in external matters ought to be well-meaning and pleasant." "Further, a friend is called, as it were, the guardian of love—or, as some prefer to say, the "guardian of the soul" itself."

Friendship is essential for our faith life to thrive. It was the bond of friendship that motivated Jonathan to speak to Saul in David's defense. His intervention brought about a reconciliation between the two – albeit a temporary one. As a faithful friend, Jonathan gave David unwavering and loyal support. Goodwill, affection, and faithfulness are traits our society desperately needs today. We need to discover words that will build people up rather than trash and tear them down. Alliances of love and support are few and far between. In the face of harassment and bigotry, we need to stand up for the dignity of every person. Yes, you and I are our

brother's keeper and our sister's helpmate. Despite the odds against us, we can make a difference. Recall this quote attributed to Edmund Purke. "The only thing persons for the triumph of

to Edmund Burke. "The only thing necessary for the triumph of evil is for good men to do nothing." God is one but he is not a solitary reality; he is a communion of Persons. When God created man, he made men and women in his image and likeness. Since God is a communion of persons, he knew that it was not good for a man, or a woman, to live in isolation. God loves us and desires us to share his communion of love. Scripture tells us: "God saw everything that he had made, and behold, it was very good" (Gen 1:31). God shared his vision of the world with us. With the eyes of love, we can see the goodness of every creature. When van Gogh was beginning work on his masterpiece, 'The Starry Night', he was a patient in a mental hospital. During his confinement, he was not allowed to paint. However, he did have access to a window and through that window, he would gaze at the sky. He drew upon the impression the sky had left in his memory when he eventually took up a palette and brush. Van Gogh's appreciation for the beauty he had admired motivated him to produce this awesome painting. In a letter to his brother Theo, he wrote: "Admire as much as you can, most people don't admire enough." If we were to cultivate a heartfelt admiration for the people and world around us, we would discover the treasure God has entrusted to our care. Friends who stand by each other and encourage one another give a never-to-be-forgotten sensation of standing in the presence of God and participating in the neverending dance of the Trinity. May we be found worthy of such friendship.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The expression 'every day is a gift' may have a connection with 1 Peter where we read that time is a gift from God. A direction of stewardship and service as we continue to unwrap that gift of life given us to share with others. The resolutions of the New Year (for those who may have taken an inventory of life and seek to advance in certain intentions that are oriented towards purposeful gospel living) we appreciate a process as we develop in life and in our faith and habits that are in line



with the teachings of the Gospel.

While reading Michael Casey OCSO, he wrote of that which might paralvze some of our intentions. He was very direct in offering that it is not possible to wipe the slate clean and make a break. or a new start. due to the degree that we have past liabilities. He detailed skills that are left undeveloped and past regrets and weaknesses and mistakes made. These arise in a culture that

seeks 'instant' change and transformation which counters the direction of living patiently with imperfections and continue to seek to change and alter our day to day in a manner that asks for a patient development and continuation in our journey of faith. Each liturgy begins with an asking for mercy, and I wonder how many of us are really asking for the gift of grace that disposes ourselves to the kind of change that is, again, a patient process. Paralysis spiritually can effect a feeling of being useless and ineffective. In Mark's Gospel these past days, we have been reading about the kind of effect that Jesus had on the lame and the crippled (as well as those possessed of spirits counter to healthy living). One was the man with the withered hand. I believe it happened on a Sabbath. The man with the paralyzed hand was restored to soundness. Healthy and free from paralysis. May our frame of mind also be enlarged as we ask for the mercy and grace and so prepared to have our weaknesses made strong and appreciate as well that weaknesses exist in others as well. Patience is a gift. May one of the resolutions this year include the unwrapping of that gift as we patiently await the One who promised to return in time. May our share in the liturgy be a restorative time of receiving God's mercy and healing. May we bear the fruit of patient endurance.

This past week. I managed taking a little time for myself. I spent the Saturday a week ago with my family. It was such a blessing. We got together to pick out my sister Bridget's wedding dress. It was bittersweet because my Mom would have loved the adventure. After the appointment we went for food and I could feel the love and more importantly, while not there physically, I could feel the blessings given to us by both Mom and Dad. This brought to mind the nightly blessing they always gave us. "Good night, God bless you and keep you." Then on this past Tuesday night's evening prayer, was Psalm 116. The psalmist, and I was reminded again about answered prayers, being healed in my "sorrow and distress", receiving God's compassion and knowing in my helplessness, I was saved. How I walk a path that seems steep, winding and I am not to be able to see around the next corner, but never alone. This made me look at how some of the verses were written and I thought I could see the corner. Example: (First line) Your servant, Lord, your servant am I; (next line) you have loosened my bonds." I am a servant of the Lord. I try to live my life following this path but I have choices. God wants me to make this choice freely and whole heartily. He wants to live in my heart and follow in the footsteps of Jesus. It is my response God seeks, but only if I too want it. The effects of these blessings stay with me always. In the change of my heart as in scriptures, prayer and Eucharist, those winding roads with corners that I can not see around, come with less distress and a desire to keep walking forward. With loosened bonds, the gifts given in the Sacraments, and the scriptures, the mercy, compassion and love abounding. Those loosened bonds allow me to walk closer to God, allow me to be healed, restored and rejuvenated to walk around corners while not seeing the path ahead. It is the blessings from God that overcomes what my mind wants me to do and follow my heart. While I work at this relationship with God, this walk creates a desire in my heart to stay on the path. It has taken me years, that include sometimes having to retrace steps when I missed a turn, but even then, when finding the path again, the blessings make my heart soar. These blessings come with this path. There are people on it that supported me, encouraged me and became part of the blessings. In the liturgy of the hours, I can relate with the psalmist saying, "been there, done that, have the t-shirt" but look at the blessings from God you might have missed. Come with me and praise God. The psalmist lets the world know they too are human, they failed, like me they have questions but God's love, if I so choose to open my heart and mind, has always been there. It is God's presence in his blessings that brings beauty and His love to the forefront. It is in the acknowledgement of these gifts that make me smile and say "I am blessed."
