The Master Gardener is also the one who lavishly and extravagantly scatters the Seed of the Word. The seeds he sows are bustling with life and fecundity. Once we receive the implanted Word, it is a marvel to watch it grow. "Of its own accord the land yields fruit, first the blade, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear" (Mk.4:28). The amazing thing about this is that it is all God's work, all we need to do is let it happen. If we let the Word find a receptive heart, it will produce the harvest within us. God who is rich in mercy plants within us a seed that is pulsing with life. It grows gradually, but tenaciously. It puts down deep roots and holds firm in the receptive heart. Once it has sprung up, it produces its intended harvest. What a wonder to behold! The Living Word works its way into our hearts and transforms us. The secret growth of the seed demonstrates how God's action in our lives is beyond our understanding and control and often produces surprising results.

The parable of the seed invites us to ponder the relationship between the movement of God's grace and our participation. The seed grows independent of our understanding, while it needs our participation to find fertile ground. We need to trust in the unseen and effective work of God's grace in our lives and then we need to be willing to act on the lights we receive from our loving Father. God who is faithful and true will plant a shoot of healing among us. Under his watchful gaze, it will put forth branches for all of us to find a place of peace and security.

## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

I had mentioned both to the young members of our Parish School of Religion as well as the students at St. Benedict that both the letter to the Hebrews as well as the Gospel of Mark were a prologue or an introduction. With Hebrews we read of the introduction about the incarnation of Jesus who came in the flesh. With Mark we understand the calling of the first four disciples and then the teaching of Jesus as well as the heal-



ings that occurred both in a public place (synagogue) as well as in the private home of Peter. And so, the beginning of the story as well as the beginning of the ministry of Jesus. The question became as to how we enter into both the story as we are participants in the history of salvation and how we share in the service of Jesus. After the healings and exorcisms that Jesus effected (one of them initiating the service of Peter's mother in law) came a number of people seek-

ing out Jesus as well. They pursued Him (chased Him down so to speak and He was at prayer (in communion with the Father) we read as well. "Everyone is looking for you" were the words of Simon (not yet given the name Peter). Jesus's response (I have read) had a special implication and inference (perhaps) as He responded "Let US go on to the nearby villages which had the hint or suggestion that the four called had more to learn as followers and gradually gaining the capacity to act in Jesus name. (Evidenced in Acts with Peter and Tabitha). In a word there is more to learn about our capacity to live in likeness to the Word made Flesh. The beginning of ordinary time and in this new year we may have the opportunity to rethink our direction of life each time we participate in the liturgy. We recall the blessing of the prior sacramentary GO IN PEACE TO LOVE AND SERVE THE LORD. As we seek to imitate the word made flesh, we too, are entrusted with the prayer that seeks to have the Father's will done here on earth. May we seek that kind of union in our daily prayer and ask for the greater capacity to witness in our own personal stories being in the company of Christ in our day to day.

## From Bobbi Bugaj

I have spent the Advent and Christmas season remembering the first coming of Jesus and growing in anticipation of his coming again. I have searched my heart and cleaned out cobwebs and those things in my heart (things ignored) that I may have allowed to be there in moments of distraction or maybe it was the easier decision. I have found that these two seasons allows me to once again, walk the path of Jesus. Then we get into Ordinary time and I am more willing, a little more each year to open myself in a way that those cobwebs and distractions have taken away. It allows me once again to fully embrace the change. The next couple of weeks, (I peeked ahead) there will be the wedding in Cana, the Presentation of the Lord, fishers of men and blessed are they and woe to you. Wow, makes me stop and think in a few minutes in what is coming ahead and new responses from me. The wedding feast of Cana, will I drink the new wine or drink the old? Can I change my thoughts, words and actions to follow Christ? I love that Mary advises "Do whatever he tells you to do." That is a hard statement. That path that I walk can sometimes become steep, winding and confusing. I can get tired, irritable, and confused. Then I stop to think, I am being advised by the first "saint" who said "yes" unreservedly. She faced some really hard times after that decision and went to territories unknown both physically and mentally and still says "do whatever he tells you to do." I am not good at that. I have and want questions answered. I am more than willing sometime to question this path and want reassurances. (By the way, I know the reassurances, I just may or may not want to walk the path at this time.) Now, here comes my thoughts of joy, I love drinking the wine that Jesus made. I love Mary's nudge to do what Jesus tells me to do. Because hard or not, that is the path that brings joy. It is the harder path, becoming sweeter as I walk it because in following this path, while maybe harder, brings me to interactions in life that I would never experience without walking it. I learned in my most heartbreaking moments with my Mom, that she loved her painful, confused, and ever shrinking world. That in all of that, she could see beauty outside her window. She could remember her prayers and pray them whole heartedly while maybe not knowing who I was. But she always knew, in her confusion that she could trust me and trust me she did. I am firmly convinced that it was her prayer life that made the path she walked (or shuffled) possible because she did whatever the Spirit told her to do. I know it was her faith that healed her in ways that I can imagine, but it is a path that I too walk by faith. Ordinary time is a time to mature and grow. To ready myself for Lent and the Easter season, and then going back to ordinary time. I will change and grow becoming what God wants of me with nudges from the Spirit. Those changes every year walk me to Christ the King at the end of the year, and a deeper understanding of what that kingship is. I love my faith, my struggles and my changes because I walk the path to eternal life. Amen
